Warning Signs - checklists updated

As part of the ongoing review and expansion of our online resources, Stop It Now! just posted updates to our <u>Warning Signs</u> checklists.

Warning Signs is the most frequently visited page on our website.

We've included more behaviors that may be violations of personal boundaries that aren't specifically sexual. These "boundary violation" behaviors break down personal safeguards and can make children more vulnerable to being abused or to acting in harmful ways. Recognizing and acting to redirect these types of behaviors can prevent a child from being harmed - or causing harm to others.

Nigerian Chief visits with Now!

Last month, the Stop It Now! was honored by a visit from one of the few women Chiefs in Nigeria, Mrs. Ugo Nnachi. Ugo is a tireless activist and leader for gender equity in her home state of Ibonyi - and the founder and director of DOVENET, a women's safety and empowerment organization in Ibonyi.

Ugo described the nature of child sexual exploitation in the Nigerian cultural context, and we discussed how Now!'s approach to violence prevention might apply. She is taking back a set of Stop It Now! resources, example of our advertising posters, and many new ideas. As reported in the October 2006 Now! NEWS, international interest in Stop It Now! remains strong.

Ugo's visit to the Northeast was hosted by Men's Resources International (MRI), a new international organization that has been working with DOVENET to create the Ebonyi Men's Resource Centre. Building on 20 years of promoting and supporting positive alternatives to stereotypical masculinity in the U.S., MRI is helping to organize men in diverse communities so that they can ally with women to end combat gender-based violence.

New Guidebook due out soon

An **updated and significantly expanded** version of Stop It Now!'s groundbreaking <u>Do Children Sexually Abuse Other Children</u> publication is in the final stage of development. It will be ready for publication within the next month. *Do Children* has been out of print for several months, but we believe

the expanded version will be worth the wait.

According to studies, children under the age of 18 commit 30 - 50% of sexual abuse. This guidebook offers information on how to distinguish healthy and age-appropriate sexual development from sexually abusing behaviors. It offers guidance on how to talk to children about sexual abuse and what to do if a child discloses abuse. The public rarely recognizes the seriousness of these cases in which a child is abusing another child. <u>Do Children</u> reminds readers that there is **help available for both the child who was harmed and the child who did the harm.**

The new text will feature added material on the dynamics of sexually harmful behavior among youth; a section on child pornography; and more in-depth information about creating safe environments by identifying early signs of concerning behaviors and redirecting the behaviors before they become abusive.
